Twelve-year-old Marinka dreams of a normal life, where her house stays in one place long enough for her to make friends. But her house has chicken legs and moves on without warning. The only people Marinka meets are dead, and they disappear when her grandmother, Baba Yaga, guides them through The Gate.

Extract from the book:

"I light the candles in the skulls at dusk. An orange glow flickers out from their empty eye sockets, beckoning the dead. They appear on the horizon like mist and take shape as they stumble over the rocky ground towards the house."

"This story is about a girl called Marinka who lives with her grandmother Baba Yaga. Yagas are destined to guide the

dead for the rest of their lives (hundreds of years +). Marinka dreams of a different life, a life where her only friends are not just animals.

The Chronicles of Avantia


I recommend this book to anyone who likes action, thrillers and stories about mythological beasts.

Year 4 Learning

Class 14 have been experimenting with clay in order to make some clay tiles of some scenes of the River Thames.

We learned how to "scratch and stick" to make the pieces of clay stick together and not break. This will help us to build up our 3-d effects on our clay tiles and bring the buildings to life. We also learned that the clay will need to go into the kiln and be fired in order to make our tiles ready to glaze. We used lots of different tools






to make marks on our clay to create texture we experimented with different ways of using the tools to create the textures that we wanted. When we make our tiles we will be thinking about texture, pattern and building 3-d effects.

"Making the patterns on the clay was so satisfying." Elaiyah. "I was amazed that the scratch and stick held big pieces of clay on top of small pieces really easily." Daniyyel.



In Science this term, Year 4 have been studying Living Things and their Habitats. In this week's lesson we have been considering ways in which humans might negatively impact on the environment.

Last term whilst studying the invertebrates that live in our school's habitat, we noticed that lots of litter was being blown through the gates on Goodrich Road into the school's garden. Today we decided to spend 10 minutes collecting this litter and studying how it was negatively impacting on the invertebrates' habitat. We were shocked at just how much litter was there. We found snails, slugs and spiders inside plastic bags and crisp packets. We also found evidence that snails were eating some of the rubbish.













In PE Class 15 have just started their unit on Athletics and have loved practising running, jumping and throwing. They are looking forward to developing their skills further - great preparation for Sports Day!






VotesforSchools
