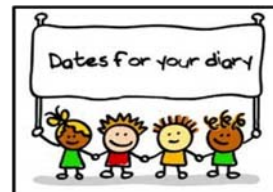
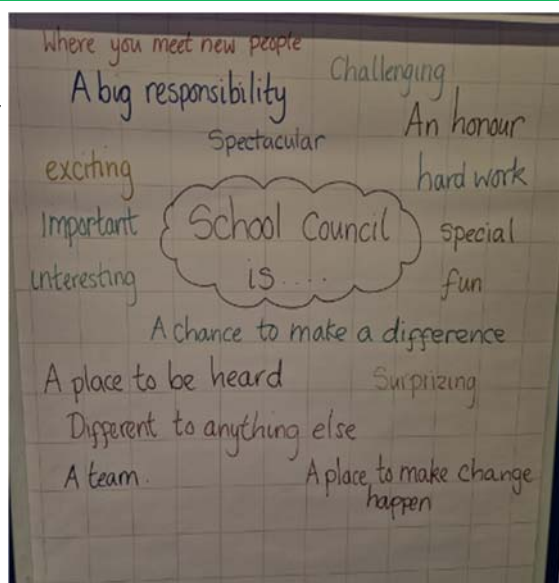

"I liked it when the meteor shower came," Alfie.

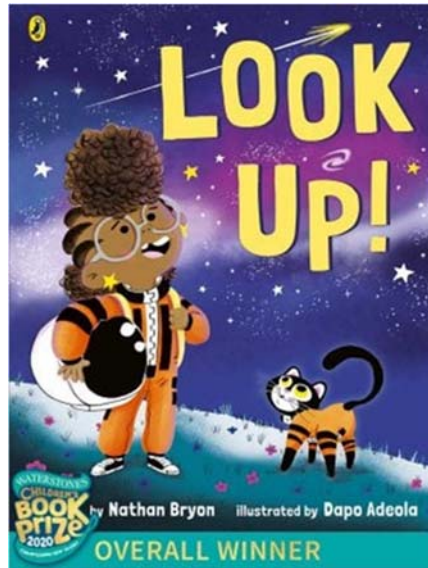
"I liked that the boy put his phone down and looked up," Ava.

"I liked when the meteors came and they were different colours," Fahmida.



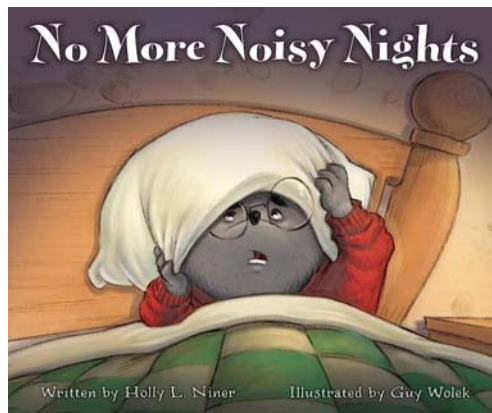
Class 24 have really enjoyed listening to 'No More Noisy Nights' by Holly L Niner.

We enjoyed reading all about the animals and the different dances they could do, although we felt quite upset for Gerald the giraffe when the other animals were being unkind to him.

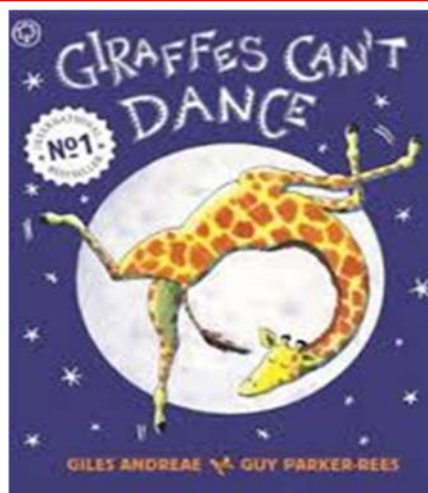
It was a relief when the rest of the animals finally decided to be kind to Gerald.

Ms Jackson, Music Tutor, is retiring. She works one day a week and has been sharing her skills knowledge for over 20 years.

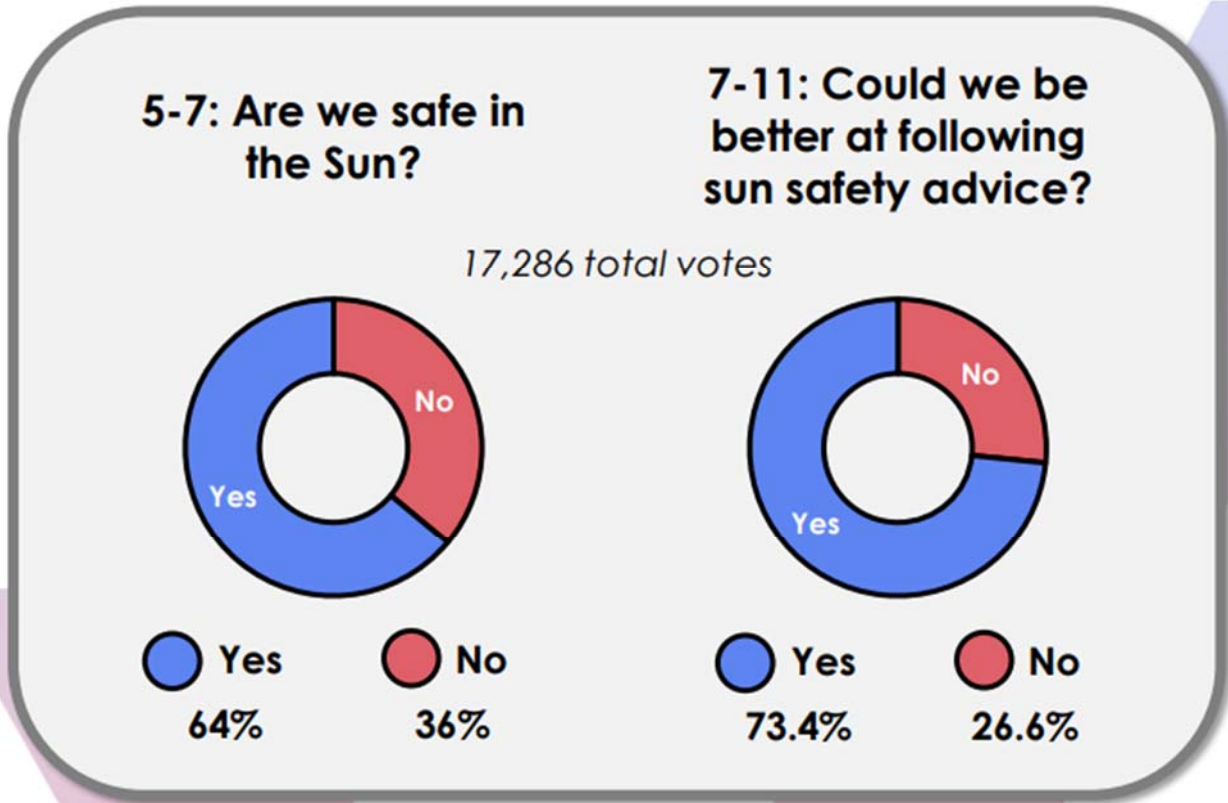


Ms Kane, who works one day a week, is going to focus on family and other interests.
