



Autumn One






From first day nerves to finding your peg, this reassuring read is full of humour and fun for children and parents alike. A classic picture book which offers advice and enjoyment for the whole family.






Autumn Two






This is a lovely book for children about the celebrations of Hanukkah and Christmas. The illustrations really are very beautiful.


Spring One




Eddy has lost Freddy, his teddy, in the wood, so he goes to look for him. But the wood is dark and horrible and soon Eddy gets scared.




Spring Two




Summer One






In Eric Carle's humorous story about a bad-tempered ladybird, the concepts of time and size are explored through ingenious die cuts and glorious colour.





A simple, elegant imaginary tale.






Wonderful artwork - with great expressions from the arachnid protagonist. The silhouettes are compelling, though simple. Anansi the trickster brought to life for a new generation.










What do you know about ducks? I bet you know that they quack ... a lot! Well, discover much more in this book that's all about, well, just ducks!



This hilarious retelling of the classic Russian tale about a farmer whose turnip is impossible to pull from the ground uses simple vocabulary and is ideal for reading aloud.




There once was a large country that was ruled by a General. The General would take his army and attack all the countries around him until they were conquered.







You Can't Catch Me and You Can't Put Mustard in the Custard were groundbreaking collections of poems for children. They are combined here for the first time.




Where the willow tree meets the water, a tadpole met a caterpillar. They gazed into each other's tiny eyes...and fell in love.




Once upon a time there was an enchanting fairytale about a prince who was looking for a real princess to be his bride.






Summer Two
