GUIDANCE

- Children and young people across the country have experienced unprecedented disruption to their education as a result of coronavirus (COVID-19). Those from the most vulnerable and disadvantaged backgrounds may be among those hardest hit. The aggregate impact of lost time in education will be substantial, and the scale of our response must match the scale of the challenge.
- Schools' allocations will be calculated on a per pupil basis, providing each mainstream school with a total of £80 for each pupil in years reception through to 11.
- As the catch-up premium has been designed to mitigate the effects of the unique disruption caused by coronavirus (COVID-19), the grant will only be available for the 2020 to 2021 academic year. It will not be added to schools' baselines in calculating future years' funding allocations.

As a school some of our pupils come to us with little spoken English and there is usually a great deal of progress seen in Nursery and reception in terms of language acquisition in most years. Due to the closure the current Reception cohort would benefit from a specific intervention to address this. The Reception NELI programme involves scripted individual and small-group language activities delivered by teaching assistants (TAs), early years educators or teachers, to children identified as being in need of targeted language support.
